




Hanging Out with Linen

Once this is done, simply attach the string or ribbon to the wall with hooks, nails, or thumbtacks, and toss the toys inside! If your child is mature enough

to not pull the hammock down, put the hammock low enough for your child to put toys in and take them out. For younger children, put the hammock about five feet off the ground to keep your little one from damaging it.

#2: Baby Sling
