Hand-sewing has its roots deep into history. As garments took on more intricate design, and beauty, hand-sewing was right there to assist in construction and details.

I find that as a community we lose these roots as technology advances. Sewing machines, while of course very useful and wonderful objects, have taken away the need to sew by hand in full and thus hand-sewing has been limited to couture methods, basting, and finishings like hems. I took to hand-sewing garments earlier this year and in the process fell in love with feeling my garment through the whole making process, falling in love with the fibers. There is also the wonderful joy and satisfaction that hand-sewing an entire garment can give you that just is not comparable to anything else.

Some of my favorite fabric to hand-sew with has been [FS Heavyweight Linen](#) for my Free Range Slacks. The fabric is sturdy in hand but soft to the touch and to wear. I especially love how the lines of the fibers allow me to follow my stitching easily and enjoy the process of making handmade garments. Knowing I am working with such high quality natural fiber is also a treat in

itself as it allows for pure indulgence in the work of hand-sewing. Their linen is just fantastic!
