



PATTERN REVIEW: Paola Workwear Jacket in Insignia Blue Linen

Description



PAOLA Jacket in INSIGNIA BLUE Midweight Linen

Ever since I uncovered a vintage French chore jacket at a flea market years ago, I have been obsessed with this timeless jacket design. If you follow me on [Pinterest](#), you are not surprised to read this. I have dreamed of creating my own version for a while and finally found the perfect sewing pattern to do it!



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Using the vintage jacket as inspiration, I decided to sew the [PAOLA Jacket](#) in Midweight [INSIGNIA BLUE](#) linen with contrasting white buttons. The fabric color reminded me of a favorite pair of worn-in denim blue jeans, but in a lighter weight and softer drape. Since I have wide shoulders and a straight body type, I chose to include only the bottom two pockets, omitting the top pockets for a less boxy style. I like the simplicity and feminine look with less pockets, especially since I already have a couple 4-pocket chore jackets in my wardrobe. If I were to make another one, I would consider adding top pockets to the inside of the garment, which is popular on many vintage chore jackets.



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I made my normal size 2 and was so happy with the amount of ease included in the pattern as well as the length of the body and sleeves. I followed the pattern exactly, finishing with french seams. This pattern was easy to follow and produced a beautifully fitting jacket. It's a perfect weight and style for layering on chilly nights. I'm already thinking about making a few more in a natural canvas, faded denim, and olive linen. Will be wearing this one all spring and summer long!
